Instructional Focus: Predictable vowel teams au/aw, Week 3

Story Number: 1

Saul Draws

Saul had a hawk with two claws. Saul liked to draw the hawk. Saul draws green claws on the hawk. What Saul drew had a flaw. The claws of the hawk were mauve, not green. Saul will draw a new hawk the next day.

Caw! Caw! The hawk's staunch caw woke Saul at dawn. Saul puts on a shawl and gets out his pen to draw. The shawl Saul has is mauve, just like the mauve claw of the hawk. Saul drew a new hawk with mauve claws and the hawk liked it.

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Story Number: 2

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Story Number: 3
